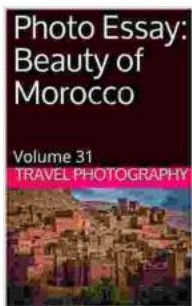

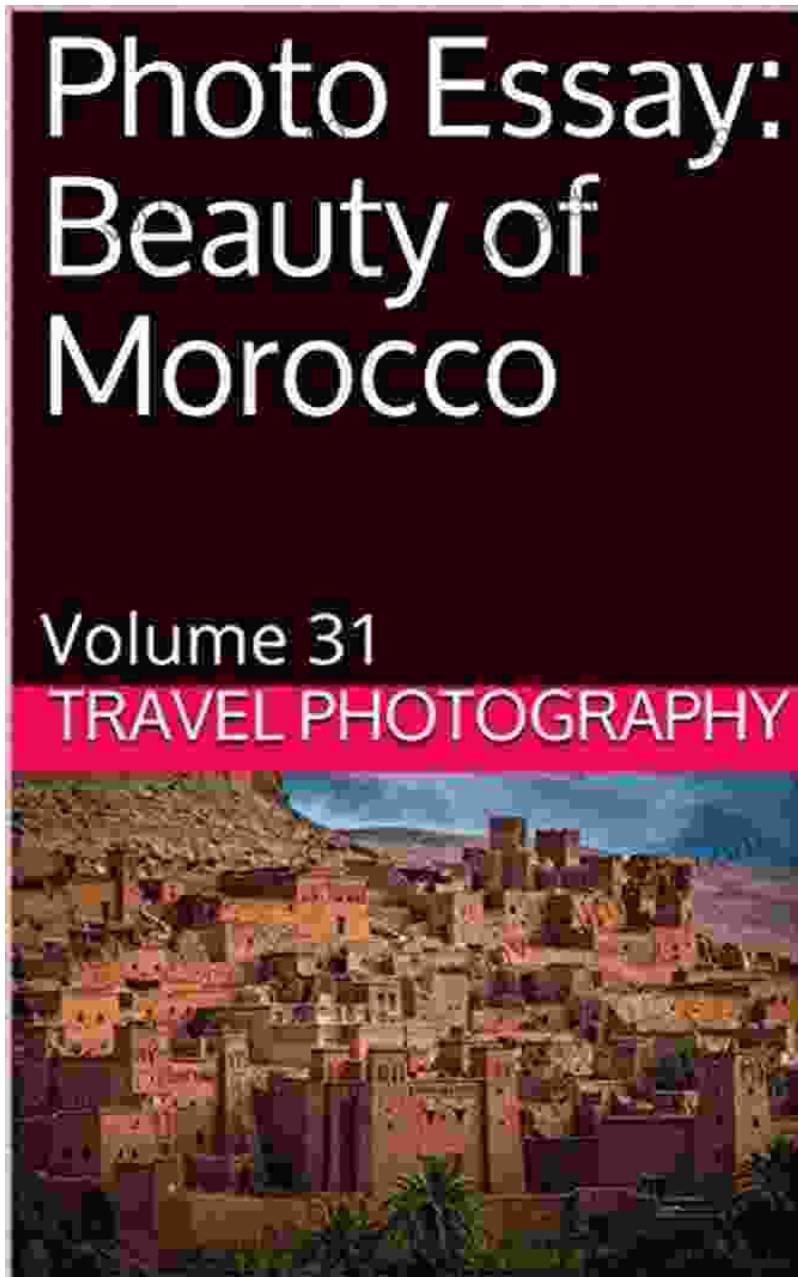

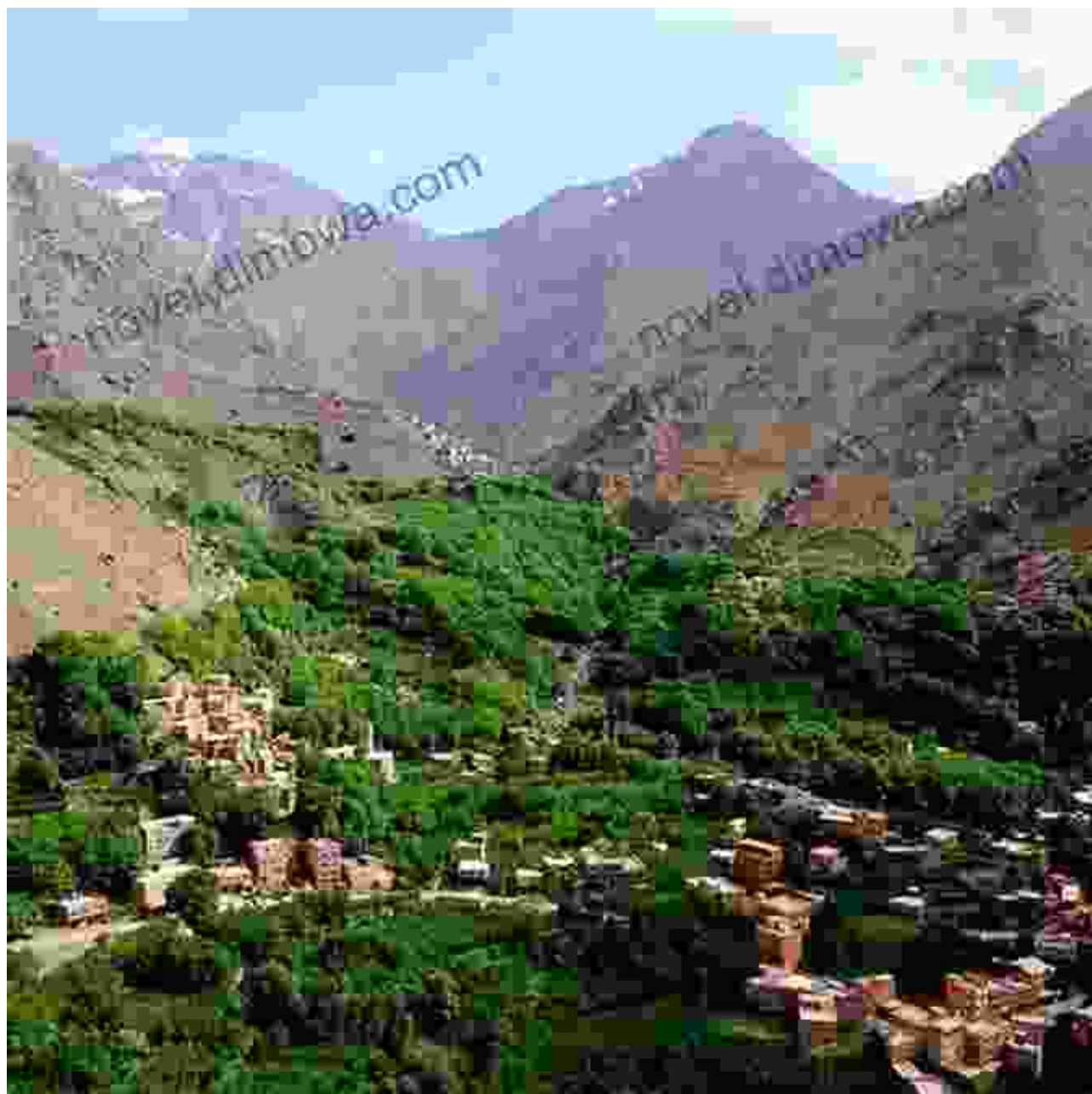

This picture of a exhausted mother, consumed with worry over the survival of her children, is one of six photographs that Lange took in the span of just a few minutes at a "pea pickers" camp. She had returned to the camp on an impulse after having driven twenty miles post it at the end of a long day of work. The woman in the picture, Florence Owens (1903-1983), was the widowed mother of eight children at the time this photograph was taken. She had been with her family in the Imperial Valley picking beets. They were on their way to Watsonville to work in the lettuce fields when car trouble forced them to stop at the "pea pickers" camp. Lange found Owens waiting for her sons to return with the needed parts.

Regardless of the particular circumstances of her being in that place at that time, the mother's pose of stoic anxiety and the encumbrance of her three young children conveyed a universal message. Americans were shocked when they saw photographs of this family published in the San Francisco News, and the federal government immediately sent twenty thousand pounds of food to the starving workers. In the years following its initial publication, *Migrant Mother* came to represent the Great Depression itself.

Florence Owens eventually had three more children, and her family kept moving, following the California crops. Owens became involved in efforts to organize farm labor and would sometimes arrive to the "pea fields" or the pea who repatriated workers for migrants as the picking season began. She was still doing field work at the age of 60, before marrying George Thompson and settling into a suburban life in Modesto, California.

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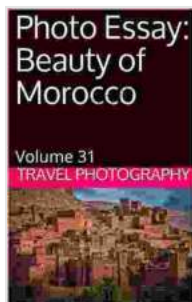


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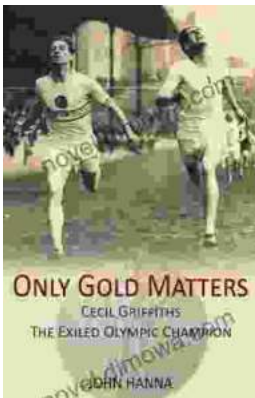
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
