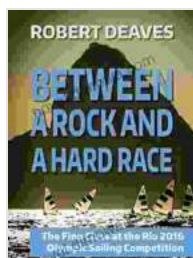

## The Course

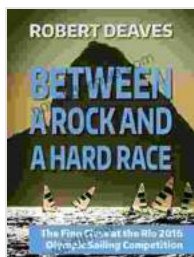
